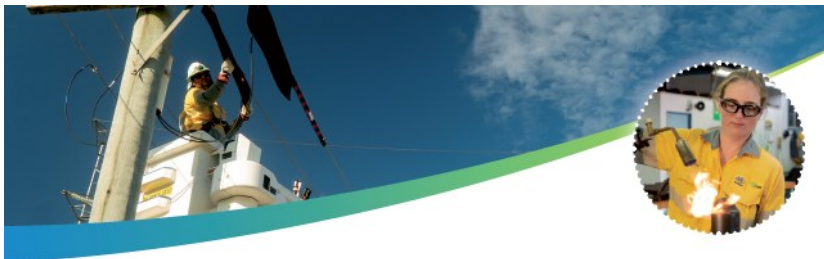

## Support

To help you complete your apprenticeship and be part of us, we will supply you with:

- Uniforms
- Personal protective equipment (PPE) - helmets, hats, glasses, gloves, safety boots etc.
- Fully equipped tool kits
- Financial assistance for subject course fees and textbooks
- Living away from home allowance, where applicable
- A Coordinator for mentoring and team support
- Employee Assistance Program - counselling and advice for personal concerns should they arise.

## Entry requirements:

To apply for an apprenticeship, you must have completed at least one of the following:

- Year 12, and passed Maths A or General Maths, English and a Science subject
- Equivalent pre-vocational studies including a Certificate II in Electrotechnology or relevant work experience
- Certificate II in Engineering Pathway/s or relevant work experience, Mechanical Trade - Diesel Fitting (apprenticeship only).

## The application process

1. Complete an online application form
2. If shortlisted, complete an online assessment
3. Attend an assessment centre (if successful), for team activities and supervised aptitude testing
4. Attend a panel interview with our representatives
5. Undertake a medical assessment (organised and paid for by us).

If successful, you'll receive a verbal offer of employment, followed by an electronic offer and relevant information, with your employment commencing in late January or early February each year.

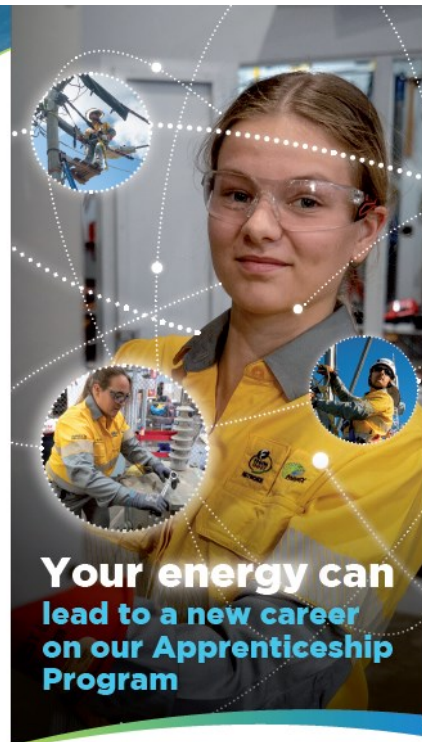
